20 **A. INTRODUCTION**

21 The Chino Basin Watermaster Advisory Committee
22 ("Advisory Committee" hereinafter) offers this document and,
23 particularly, the proposed Order attached hereto as Exhibit "A" as
24 its response to the Court's Order to Show Cause on the above-
25 referenced matter. The proposed Order attached hereto
26 substantially conforms to orders on these matters recommended by
27 the Court's Special Referee in her report. It is the belief of
28 the Advisory Committee that the new Watermaster Board, with the

1 good faith cooperation of all parties, will function fairly and
2 will be able to produce the Optimum Basin Management Plan within
3 the timelines suggested in the proposed Order, thereby addressing
4 the issues upon which the Referee's report focused. Further, the
5 Advisory Committee welcomes the continued participation of the
6 Special Referee, together with her technical assistant, in the
7 process of producing the Optimum Basin Management Plan. It is
8 anticipated that the Special Referee's continued participation
9 will aid in building the consensus required to generate a plan
10 which the Court may approve within the period of time prescribed
11 in the proposed Order.

12 **B. THE PROPOSED ORDER**

13 The Proposed Order would commence the term of the new
14 Watermaster on March 1, 1998. In accordance with the pending
15 motion, the proposed diverse Board would consist of nine members,
16 two appointed by the Overlying (Agricultural) Pool, one appointed
17 by the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool, three appointed by the
18 Appropriative Pool and one member each appointed by the Board of
19 Directors of Three Valleys Municipal Water District, Western
20 Municipal Water District and Chino Basin Municipal Water District.
21 No individual member of the Watermaster Board could concurrently
22 hold a seat on the Advisory Committee or a pool committee with the
23 exception of the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool. The Proposed
24 Order encourages participating public agencies to have elected
25 officials appointed as their representatives. Of course, the
26 Proposed Order provides for members of the Watermaster Board to
27 vote on a one person-one vote basis rather than on the basis of
28 amount of water production or any other weighted basis.

1 Compared to the original Order suggested months ago, the
2 Proposed Order has been expanded as to details involving the
3 staggering of terms so as to generate the maximum diversity of
4 thought and input on the Board over time. Subparagraph 1(e)
5 provides that the entire initial nine member Board will serve
6 until June 30, 2000, a term of two years and three months.
7 However, to provide for maximum staggering of terms, that
8 subparagraph 1(e) then requires each subgroup making Board
9 appointments to extend the term of two of its appointed board
10 members, one for one additional year and one for two additional
11 years. The result is staggered terms spread among each subgroup
12 on the Board. The subgroups consist of the members appointed by
13 the Overlying Pools, the members appointed by the Appropriative
14 Pool and the members appointed by the Municipal Water Districts.
15 Each subgroup will have rotating terms for appointees rather than
16 the Watermaster Board having rotating terms for entire subgroups.
17 This method of rotation will allow for an influx of fresh thought
18 from each subgroup having the right to appoint members to the
19 Watermaster Board while also retaining continuity in each such
20 subgroup.

21 Subparagraph 1(g) of the Proposed Order provides for the
22 replacement of Watermaster Board members who resign, become
23 ineligible to serve or lack capacity to serve. Such a provision
24 inadvertently was omitted from the original Proposed Order.

25 In accordance with the Special Referee's suggestion,
26 subparagraph 1(h) of the Proposed Order provides for the
27 Watermaster to notice a hearing at which all parties may provide
28 input on whether the nine member Watermaster Board should continue

1 past June 30, 2000. The Proposed Order requires for that hearing
2 to occur on or before March 15, 2000 in order to provide ample
3 time for the Court to order and implement any modification to the
4 constituency of the Watermaster which the Court may wish to
5 consider at the time.

6 Paragraph 2 of the Proposed Order is a direction to
7 Chino Basin Municipal Water District to take any actions necessary
8 to cause a transition of its present Watermaster staff members to
9 staff supporting the new Watermaster while maintaining for those
10 employees their credits and benefit programs. The Advisory
11 Committee believes that that specific order is consistent with
12 prior expressions of the Court's concern for the welfare of the
13 employees.

14 Paragraph 3 of the Proposed Order continues the
15 appointment of Anne J. Schneider as the Court's Special Referee
16 with technical aid provided by Mr. Joe Scalmanini. It is expected
17 that Mr. Scalmanini's work would not duplicate the engineering and
18 hydrology work already completed. Of course, the purport of
19 paragraph 3 is to provide the continued participation and
20 oversight of the Court's Special Referee through the process of
21 generating the Optimum Basin Management Plan identified in the
22 Referee's Report as a matter crucial to the management of the
23 Chino Basin.

24 Paragraph 4 of the Proposed Order establishes timelines
25 and a process for the generation of the Optimum Basin Management
26 Plan ("the Plan") under supervision of the Court's Special Referee
27 and the Court with specific timelines meant to provide sufficient
28 time to reach benchmarks while maintaining progress toward the

1 generation of the Plan. The Advisory Committee submits that this
2 process is in accord with the Special Referee's suggestions with
3 the exception of the specific benchmark dates which have been
4 modified for reasons discussed below.

5 Paragraph 4 of the Proposed Order provides that on or
6 before June 1, 1998, only 90 days after the Watermaster Board is
7 formulated, parties shall submit recommendations to the new Board
8 as to the scope and level of detail of the Plan. The Proposed
9 Order then provides for the Watermaster to file its written
10 recommendations as to that scoping by way of motion seeking Court
11 approval of the scoping. The Watermaster is to file the written
12 recommendations with the Court on or before July 1, 1998 and set a
13 motion for the Court's consideration which is contemplated to
14 occur sometime during June or July, 1998. The Proposed Order
15 specifically provides for the Special Referee to give her input
16 with respect to the scoping recommendations made by the
17 Watermaster. The proposed Order also provides for the Special
18 Referee to make periodic written assessments to the Court on the
19 Watermaster's progress in developing and completing the Plan.

20 In essence, the Watermaster is afforded seventeen to
21 eighteen months to present the Plan to the Court for approval at a
22 hearing. That hearing is to occur on or before December 31, 1999.
23 If the Watermaster is unable to do so, the Watermaster still is
24 required to file a noticed motion which is to be heard on or
25 before December 31, 1999, by which the Watermaster (i) must
26 explain why it could not meet the timeline for completing the Plan
27 and (ii) must seek an alternative order of Court.

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1 In summary, the Proposed Order provides a twenty-one
2 month period commencing with the formulation of the new
3 Watermaster Board for the presentation to the Court for approval
4 of an Optimum Basin Management Plan with the Court's Special
5 Referee and Technical Assistant being involved in the entire
6 twenty-one month process. If the time for the process is required
7 to be extended, the Watermaster must file a motion explaining why
8 that is the case and seeking a new timeline. All of this is to
9 occur six months prior to the expiration of the term of the first
10 members of the Watermaster Board so that if a new timeline is
11 required or a new Watermaster constituency is considered by the
12 Court, the Court will have ample time to do so. The Advisory
13 Committee is suggesting the above process as an alternative to
14 characterizing the nine member board as an "Interim" Watermaster
15 or providing for an automatic transition from the Watermaster
16 Board to a Watermaster consisting of the State Department of Water
17 Resources, an outcome sought by no party to the Judgment.

18 **C. AREAS OF DEVIATION FROM REFEREE'S SUGGESTED ORDERS**

19 The Proposed Order attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and
20 discussed above does contain three areas in which the same
21 deviates from the recommendations of the Court's Special Referee.
22 However, the Advisory Committee submits that none of the
23 deviations should be considered substantial.

24 The first deviation is a deviation as to suggested
25 timelines both as to scoping recommendations and the completion of
26 the Plan. The Special Referee suggested that the scoping
27 recommendations from the parties be submitted to the Watermaster
28 by March 1 and that the Watermaster file a scoping recommendation

1 with the Court by April 1. This undoubtedly was based upon the
2 Special Referee's thought that the new Watermaster Board could be
3 instituted more quickly than has been the case. The Special
4 Referee's suggested timeline would have afforded three and one-
5 half months from the date of her report for the Watermaster to
6 file written recommendations on scoping with the Court. The
7 Proposed Order provides the parties to the Judgment three months
8 subsequent to the Watermaster Board being constituted to supply
9 its scoping recommendations to that Board. The Board then is
10 afforded one month to file its written recommendations with the
11 Court. Accordingly, the Proposed Order provides a four month
12 period of time for recommendations on scoping to be presented to
13 the Court, a period which is substantially equivalent to the
14 Special Referee's suggestion and which takes into consideration
15 the current Watermaster meeting calendar which already has been
16 noticed pursuant to the Judgment. The Special Referee then
17 contemplated the submission of the Optimum Basin Management Plan
18 to the Court fifteen months subsequent to the time when the
19 scoping recommendations were submitted with the Court. The
20 Proposed Order provides for a seventeen to eighteen month period
21 of time. That is, the Watermaster is required to submit its
22 scoping recommendations to the Court on or before July 1, 1998
23 with the hope that the Court will approve those recommendations
24 sometime in June or July, 1998, following a hearing on the matter.
25 Assuming that the Court does approve the written recommendations
26 as to scoping during June, 1998, there is afforded to the
27 Watermaster an eighteen month period of time to seek the Court's
28 approval of the Optimum Basin Management Plan (on or before

1 December 31, 1999). If the Court approves scoping during July,
2 1998, a seventeen month period is provided. The Advisory
3 Committee submits that this presents a minor deviation from the
4 timeline suggested by the Special Referee.

5 Again, the Proposed Order provides a six month period of
6 time subsequent to the date when the Court will consider the
7 Optimum Basin Management Plan during December, 1999, to consider
8 any warranted changes in the constituency of the Watermaster based
9 on the performance of the Watermaster to that date. Of course,
10 the performance of the Watermaster is in large part dependent upon
11 the good faith efforts of all of the parties to the Judgment in
12 reaching consensus on an Optimum Basin Management Plan which
13 addresses the quantity and quality problems confronted by all
14 persons and entities producing water from the Chino Basin. The
15 Advisory Committee hopes and feels that the participation of the
16 Special Referee in these matters will facilitate that consensus
17 building. In any event, it seems preferable for the Court to have
18 a sufficient period of time to decide whether it would be
19 productive to modify the constituency or identity of the
20 Watermaster during the six months commencing on January 1, 2000
21 than providing for some automatic mechanism to substitute the
22 State of California Department of Water Resources ("DWR") as
23 Watermaster.

24 The third deviation from the Special Referee's
25 suggestions does concern the Special Referee's recommendation that
26 the nine member Board be referred to as an "Interim" Watermaster
27 and that DWR become the substitute Watermaster if the Court feels
28 a need to modify the makeup or identity of the Watermaster at any

1 time during the process contemplated in the Proposed Order. The
2 Advisory Committee is well aware of the urgency to address the
3 generation and implementation of the Optimum Basin Management Plan
4 and submits to the Court that the specter of an alternative
5 Watermaster not supported or desired by any party will not provide
6 impetus to the consensus building required to promptly produce the
7 Plan. Further, if it is contemplated that DWR would become
8 Watermaster while utilizing the services of the present
9 Watermaster staff, recent experience has indicated that that may
10 be difficult if not impossible to achieve because of the personnel
11 problems inherent in DWR supervising personnel who are not State
12 employees. If, alternatively, the Court would contemplate
13 substituting DWR as Watermaster, utilizing new staff, the anxiety
14 of Watermaster staff members which has been felt during the past
15 two years, while the makeup of the Watermaster has been contested,
16 would be perpetuated for two more years. In addition, all parties
17 must recognize the value in retaining staff familiar with the
18 functions of the Watermaster. The Advisory Committee cannot
19 identify value in replacing that experienced personnel with DWR
20 employees who, by necessity, will then be unfamiliar with the
21 administration of the Judgment.

22 **D. CONCLUSION**

23 For all of the foregoing reasons, the Advisory Committee
24 is pleased to submit this Response, including the attached
25 Proposed Order which, again, is in substantial conformity with the
26 recommendations contained in the Special Referee's report

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1 presented to the Court on this matter. The Advisory Committee
2 urges the Court to approve and execute the Proposed Order.

20 The motion for appointment of a nine member board as
21 Watermaster and related matters, including a special reference,
22 came on regularly for hearing on February 19, 1998 in Department H
23 of the above-entitled Court, the Honorable J. Michael Gunn,
24 presiding.

25 The motion, having been duly made in accordance with the
26 provisions of the Judgment herein,

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IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. Commencing March 1, 1998, the position of Chino Basin Watermaster shall be filled by a nine member board selected and organized as set forth below.

(a) **Membership**

The nine-member Watermaster Board shall consist of:

(i) two members from the Overlying (Agricultural) Pool appointed by the Overlying (Agricultural) Pool;

(ii) one member from the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool appointed by the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool;

(iii) three members from the Appropriative Pool appointed by the Appropriative Pool;

(iv) one member appointed by the Board of Three Valleys Municipal Water District ("Three Valleys");

(v) one member appointed by the Board of Western Municipal Water District ("Western");

(vi) one member appointed by the Board of Chino Basin Municipal Water District.

If one of the three municipal water districts elects not to serve on the nine-member Watermaster Board, a representative from the State of California will be seated in their place. Any member of the Appropriative Pool which owns or has a controlling interest in another member of the Appropriative Pool will not be allowed to serve concurrently with said other member of the Appropriative Pool on the Watermaster Board.

1 (b) No Concurrent Seat on Advisory Committee

2 No individual will be allowed to serve
3 concurrently on the Watermaster Board while serving as a member of
4 the Chino Basin Watermaster Advisory Committee and/or their
5 respective Pool Committee, with the exception of representatives
6 from the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool. This shall not
7 prevent the same member agency or entity with a representative on
8 the Chino Basin Advisory Committee from appointing a different
9 representative to the Watermaster Board. Additionally,
10 participating agencies with governing bodies are strongly
11 encouraged to have elected officials serve as their representative
12 on the Watermaster Board.

13 (c) Terms on Watermaster Board. Rotation Among
14 Parties.

15 Except as to members of the first Watermaster
16 Board, Watermaster Board members shall serve staggered two-year
17 terms. The appointments by the Municipal Water District boards,
18 the Appropriative Pool and the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool
19 shall be made on a rotating basis with all members afforded an
20 equal opportunity to serve. Appointments by the Overlying
21 (Agricultural) Pool shall be rotated among categories of
22 agricultural producers with each category of producers having an
23 equal opportunity to serve. The State of California shall be
24 included as one of the categories of producers rotating from the
25 Overlying (Agricultural) Pool, unless the State of California is
26 currently serving in a vacant municipal water district position.

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(d) Voting Power

The members of the Watermaster Board will vote on a one person-one vote basis.

(e) Terms of Initial Appointees to Watermaster Board

Except as otherwise provided in this paragraph, the first nine-member Watermaster Board will serve until June 30, 2000. At least 60 days prior to June 30, 2000, the Appropriative Pool shall extend the term of one of its then current Watermaster Board representatives to June 30, 2001 and shall extend the term of another of its then current Watermaster Board representatives to June 30, 2002. At least 60 days prior to June 30, 2000, the Overlying (Agricultural) Pool and the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool shall jointly extend the term of one of the three then current Watermaster Board representatives of the two pools to June 30, 2001 and shall extend the term of another of the three then current Watermaster Board representatives of the two pools to June 30, 2002. At least 60 days prior to June 30, 2000, the three Municipal Water Districts shall jointly extend the term of one of the three then current Watermaster Board representatives of those three districts to June 30, 2001 and shall extend the term of another of the three then current Watermaster Board representatives of those three districts to June 30, 2002.

(f) The Court hereby orders the Chief of Watermaster Services to file the names of the representatives, including any alternates thereto, with the Court and to serve a
/ / / / /

1 copy of the names of the representatives and any such alternates
2 on the active parties by not later than March 15, 1998.

3 (g) **Replacement of Member of Watermaster Board**

4 Should any member of the Watermaster Board
5 resign therefrom, become ineligible to serve thereon or lack the
6 mental or physical capacity to serve thereon as determined by the
7 Court, the appointing authority shall appoint a replacement member
8 of the Watermaster Board to serve through the unexpired period of
9 the term of the replaced member.

10 (h) **Status Report As To The Continuance of the**
11 **Nine-Member Watermaster Board**

12 The Watermaster shall notice a hearing to
13 occur on or before March 15, 2000, to consider all parties' input
14 as to the continuance of the nine-member board as Watermaster
15 subsequent to June 30, 2000.

16 2. The current Watermaster, Chino Basin Municipal
17 Water District, is hereby ordered to take all steps necessary and
18 proper to ensure a smooth and orderly transition to the new
19 Watermaster Board including, but not limited to, any required
20 actions, resolutions and/or agreements which will transition all
21 of the present Watermaster staff members from their status as
22 Chino Basin Municipal Water District employees to their status as
23 employees of the Watermaster while maintaining all of their
24 employment credits and benefit programs.

25 3. Anne J. Schneider hereby is appointed as the
26 Court's Special Referee to report and make recommendations to the
27 Court concerning the contents, implementation, effectiveness, and
28 shortcomings of the Optimum Basin Management Plan referred to in

1 Paragraph 4 of this Order. Further, Joe Scalmanini hereby is
2 appointed to provide Anne J. Schneider with technical assistance
3 as required by Ms. Schneider to provide said report and
4 recommendations.

5 4. The Court hereby makes the following orders related
6 to the development of an Optimum Basin Management Plan which
7 encompasses the Implementation Plan elements identified in the
8 "Chino Basin Water Resources Management Task Force, Chino Basin
9 Water Resources Management Study Final Summary Report (September,
10 1995)" ("the Plan" hereinafter):

11 (a) On or before June 1, 1998, each party to this
12 action desiring to do so shall submit recommendations to the
13 Watermaster as to the scope and level of detail of the Plan.

14 (b) On or before July 1, 1998, the Watermaster
15 shall file with the Court its written recommendation as to the
16 scope and level of detail of the Plan, together with a duly
17 noticed motion seeking Court approval of said recommendation.

18 (c) The Court's Special Referee shall review the
19 Watermaster's said scoping recommendations for technical and legal
20 sufficiency and then provide input to the Court thereon and shall
21 provide timely written assessments to the Court on the
22 Watermaster's progress in developing and completing the Plan.

23 (d) The Watermaster shall develop and complete the
24 Plan in accordance with the Court's order as to the scoping of the
25 Plan and shall file a noticed motion seeking approval of the Plan
26 and an order directing implementation thereof; the hearing on said
27 motion shall be set to occur on or before December 31, 1999.

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1 (e) In lieu of the motion specified in
2 subparagraph 4(d) above, the Watermaster may file a noticed motion
3 showing cause why it could not comply with the order contained in
4 subparagraph 4(d) above and seeking an order of the Court
5 constituting an alternative to said subparagraph 4(d) order. Such
6 alternative motion shall be set for a hearing to occur on or
7 before December 31, 1999.

8 5. It hereby is ordered that the costs of the special
9 audit conducted by Chino Basin Municipal Water District be paid as
10 a Watermaster expense. The order contained in this Paragraph 5 is
11 made without prejudice.


