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DECLARATION OF RICHARD W. ATWATER

- I, Richard W. Atwater, hereby declare as follows:
- 1. I am currently employed as the Chief Executive Officer and General Manager of the Inland Empire Utilities Agency, a Municipal Water District (hereinafter referred to as "IEUA") and have held that position since July 1999. I have firsthand knowledge of the matters set forth herein and, if called as a witness, would be competent to testify thereto.
- 2. I have significant experience in the various groundwater projects being implemented within the Chino Basin. I have been responsible for managing and directing the California Environmental Quality Act (hereinafter referred to as "CEQA") approval process for all Peace I and now Peace II programs and projects, including the optimum Basin Management Plan (hereinafter referred to as OBMP) Programmatic Environmental Impact Report in July of 2000, the Recycled Water Master Plan Programmatic Environmental Impact Report in June 2002, as well as the Recharge Capital Improvements CE⊕A documentation and associated regulatory permits and the Chino Basin Desalter Authority Programmatic Environmental Impact Report in 2002. In addition, IEUA as a member agency of the Metropolitan Water District (hereinafter referred to as "MWD") was the lead agency for the CEQA documentation and contractual arrangements for the MWD Dry Year Yield Groundwater Storage Program (hereinafter referred to as "MWDDYY" and was executed in June 2003). MWD, Three Valleys Municipal Water District, Western Municipal Water District and IEUA have entered into a funding agreement to evaluate the expansion of the Program from 100,000 acre-feet to 150,000 acre-feet storage account.
- 3. ver the past few years, I have participated in meetings and discussions leading to the development of the Peace II documents which have been presented to the court for

consideration and approval. I submit this declaration as Chief Executive Officer and General Manager of IEUA and in support of approval of the Peace II documents.

- 4. I am familiar with and approve of the cost-sharing formula relative to the cost of operation and maintenance of those recharge facilities utilized for the recharge of recycled water as set forth in the Peace II Agreement, Article 8, Paragraph 8.1.
- 5. IEUA recognizes the critical role of recharge relative to Basin Management. I believe that by continuing implementation of projects that expand recharge capacity by IEUA and WATERMASTER, the recharge goals discussed in the Wildermuth Chino Basin Groundwater Model can be attained. Certainly those efforts are under way. IEUA staff is responsible for the design, construction and maintenance of the recharge improvements funded jointly by WATERMASTER and IEUA for Phase I and Phase II of the Recharge Master Plan. The total capital cost for Phase I and Phase II of the Recharge Master Plan is approximately \$50 million with about half (\$25 million) of that amount derived from grant funds received from the State Water Resources Control Board and the Department of Water Resources. Future improvements to the recharge facilities would also be shared equally between IEUA and WATERMASTER, including preparation of an updated Recharge Master Plan.
- 6. Supply sources for recharge water include imported water from MWD under agreements with MWD and other municipal water districts. At page 7-8 of the Groundwater Model Documentation, Mr. Wildermuth notes that replenishment capabilities through MWD may be affected by capacity limitations in the Rialto Reach of Metropolitan's Foothill Feeder. However, new replenishment connections are being installed on the Rialto pipeline to increase the operational flexibility and reliability of replenishment deliveries from MWD. In addition, IEUA with MWD and Three Valleys Municipal Water District have entered into an agreement

with the San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District to utilize the State Water Project (hereinafter referred to as "SWP") delivery pipeline (called the Azusa Pipeline) to allow additional replenishment deliveries via this facility (pipeline delivery capacity of 55 cfs). These new connections will significantly increase the SWP delivery flow capacity and reliability of SWP water supplies for Chino Basin recharge. I estimate that by 2010, the SWP water delivery capacity will increase by over 120 cfs with the completion of these new connections which represents on an annual basis the potential to increase SWP replenishment deliveries by 50,000 acre-feet.

- 7. Other methods of replenishment of the Chino Basin which are available under the Peace I agreement include "In Lieu" replenishment and aquifer storage and recovery (commonly called "ASR Wells" or injection). Both methods can significantly augment the future physical replenishment capacity at the improved recharge basins. For example, all of the MWDDYY-Storage Agreement account of 100,000 acre-feet can be delivered by In Lieu replenishment. In fact, during the past four years more than half of the approximately 80 thousand acre-feet of the SWP supplies that have been put into the MWD DYY storage account have been accomplished by In Lieu replenishment and not by physical direct replenishment via recharge basins.
- 8. MWD is also committed to expand and improve the Chino Basin's recharge capabilities. In June 2007, MWD approved the funding to assist the expanded Chino Basin Desalters and to fund \$1.5 million in groundwater modeling, engineering feasibility studies and CEQA to expand the MWD DYY program to 150,000 acre-feet. As a part of these MWD funded studies enhanced recharge methods will be evaluated in partnership with the Chino Basin Watermaster, Western Municipal Water District, Three Valleys Municipal Water District, IEUA and MWD.

- 9. The use of recycled water will also bolster Chino Basin's recharge capabilities. Recycled water is a key element in the Chino Basin Watermaster's OBMP and the Peace II Implementation Agreement(s). IEUA has been responsible for developing the Recycled Water Implementation Plan and for funding all of the design, construction and operation of the recycled water facilities serving the Chino Basin area. In addition, IEUA and Chino Basin Watermaster have received all the necessary permits from the California Department of Public Health and the Santa Ana Regional Water Quality Board (June 29, 2007) to recharge recycled water at all the planned recharge basins which will allow approximately 30,000 acre-feet on an annual average over the next 25 years of recharge of recycled water into the Chino Basin.
- 10. IEUA's Board of Directors has adopted a ten year capital improvement plan for recycled water which provides for a total capital investment of approximately \$200 million to ultimately deliver about 100,000 acre-feet of recycled water for recharge and non-potable uses such as irrigation of parks, golf courses, schools, and industrial processed water needs. This is significant in that the use of recycled water reduces the demand for SWP water by like amount. This fall IEUA staff has prepared a three-year business plan that would accelerate the implementation of the ten-year capital improvement plan by spending approximately \$120 million during the next three fiscal years to build facilities to deliver 50,000 acre-feet of recycled water by the year 2011. The acceleration of the recycled water program was in recognition of the statewide drought conditions and the recent federal court decisions related to endangered species affecting the SWP (and federal Central Valley Project) supplies.
- 11. Conservation is also a key factor which will serve to enhance the Peace I and Peace II efforts. In December 2005, the IEUA Board of Directors adopted an Urban Water Management Plan that provides projected water supplies and urban demands through 2030.

Through that plan, IEUA administers its award-winning water conservation and efficiency programs with the goal of reducing water use by 10 percent by 203. IEUA coordinates and implements these water conservation programs with all of the cities, water districts, school districts and WATERMASTER within the Chino Basin. IEUA in partnership with all the cities and water agencies within the Chino Basin has developed many innovative programs to capture rainwater on-site in new developments, implementing California Friendly landscapes that will reduce dramatically residential water use, and a variety of cash rebate incentive programs to remove lawns at existing residences and install new water efficient appliances.
