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MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES

The Chino Basin Watermaster ("Watermaster") hereby requests that the Court approve the interventions of: (1) Rafael Treto and Restorative Justice Center (dba the Community Garden Project of Rancho Cucamonga) ("Restorative Justice Center") into the Overlying (Agricultural) Pool ("Ag Pool"); and, (2) 9W Halo Western OpCo L.P. ("9W Halo") and ANG II (Multi) LLC ("ANG II") into the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool ("Non-Ag Pool") (these parties are collectively referred to herein as the "Intervening Parties").

LEGAL STANDARD T.

Paragraph 60 of the Restated Judgment provides:

Any non-party assignee of the adjudicated appropriative rights of any appropriator, or any other person newly proposing to produce water from Chino Basin, may become a party to this Judgment upon filing a petition in intervention. Said intervention must be confirmed by order of this Court. Such intervenor shall thereafter be a party bound by this judgment and entitled to the rights and privileges accorded under the Physical Solution herein, through the pool to which the Court shall assign such intervenor.

On July 14, 1978, this Court further clarified the intervention procedures in its "Order re Intervention Procedures," stating:

> [A]ll subsequent petitions in intervention may be accepted by Watermaster and accumulated for filing from time to time in an ex parte proceeding, except upon 48-hour notice to any party or to any attorney of record who shall have requested such notice; and that prior to filing with the Court, Watermaster shall be permitted to take all administrative steps pertaining to the Judgment provided, however, that no assessments shall be made until a formal order has been entered by this Court.

Pursuant to this direction. Watermaster's practice has been to accept intervention requests informally by way of a letter and then process the requests through the Pool Committees, Advisory Committee, and Watermaster Board. After this internal process, Watermaster files the request for intervention with the Court for approval along with Watermaster's recommendation as to its disposition. Only after Court approval is an intervenor formally bound by the Restated Judgment and entitled to the rights and privileges accorded under the Physical Solution. Neither the Restated Judgment nor the July 14, 1978 Order requires a hearing to be held for uncontested interventions.

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II. BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS

Over the course of the past several years, Watermaster has undertaken efforts to ensure this Court has approved the intervention of all active parties under the Judgment. (Declaration of Bradley J. Herrema ("Herrema Decl."), ¶ 3.) Pursuant to this review and recent actions by the Watermaster Board, Watermaster now respectfully requests the Court grant the interventions of the Intervening Parties for the reasons described below.

A. Interventions Into the Overlying (Agricultural) Pool

The Watermaster Board recommended approval of the interventions of Restorative Justice Center and Rafael Treto into the Ag Pool over the course of the past ten years.

- In December 2009, Watermaster received a petition for intervention from Rafael Treto so that Mr. Treto could produce water from a well drilled on his property for personal domestic and agricultural use. (Herrema Decl., ¶ 4, Ex. A.) On March 25, 2010, the Watermaster Board unanimously recommended approval of Mr. Treto's intervention into the Ag Pool. (*Id.* at ¶ 5, Ex. B.)
- In December 2010, Watermaster received a petition for intervention from Restorative Justice Center. (Herrema Decl., ¶ 6, Ex. C.) The petition requested intervention so that Restorative Justice Center could produce water from a well on its property for use in a community garden. (*Ibid.*) On January 27, 2011, the Watermaster Board unanimously recommended approval of Restorative Justice Center's intervention into the Ag Pool. (*Id.* at ¶ 7, Ex. D.)

While Watermaster has recommended approval of these interventions, it is not believed that any formal request has been made to the Court to permit Rafael Treto and Restorative Justice Center's interventions into the Judgment. Watermaster now formally requests the Court take such action and grant the interventions in accordance with Watermaster's recommendations.

В. Interventions Into the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool

The Watermaster Board has also recommended approval of the interventions of 9W Halo and ANGII into the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool ("Non-Ag Pool") over the course of the past four years.

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•	In July 2017, 9W Halo submitted a petition to intervene in the Judgment as a
	member of the Non-Ag Pool. (Herrema Decl., ¶ 8, Ex. E.) The petition stated that
	9W Halo had succeeded to Angelica Corporation's overlying right to safe yield
	(18.789 acre-feet), which Angelica Corporation ("Angelica") had presumably
	acquired from Southern Service Co., dba Blue Seal Linen ("Southern Service") (an
	original party identified in the Judgment as a member of the Non-Ag Pool). (Ibid.)
	The petition clarified that 9W Halo would continue to use the right on the same
	property and for the same purposes as Angelica. (Ibid.) The Watermaster Board
	unanimously recommended approval of 9W Halo's intervention into the Non-Ag
	Pool on July 27, 2017. (<i>Id.</i> at ¶ 9, Ex. F.)

- After 9W Halo's intervention, 9W Halo, and later, ANGII, conducted an investigation into the history of ownership of the Southern Service rights and determined: (1) Southern Service transferred its right to ANGII on March 25, 2010, and (2) ANGII temporarily leased the use of the right to Angelica Textile Services, Inc., a subsidiary of Angelica, on that same date. Watermaster was not notified of either of these transfers. (Herrema Decl., ¶ 10, Ex. G.)
- To effectuate the Southern Service and ANGII transfers and permit use of the right, ANGII submitted a letter requesting intervention into the Non-Ag Pool on January 2, 2020. (*Ibid.*) At the same time, ANGII submitted an application for the prior transfers of the Southern Service right (i.e., the permanent transfer from Southern Service to ANGII and the temporary transfer from ANGII to 9W Halo (as successor to Angelica)). (*Ibid.*) The Watermaster Board unanimously recommended approval of ANGII's intervention into the Non-Ag Pool on February 27, 2020. (*Id.* at ¶ 11, Ex. H.)

Watermaster now formally requests this Court approve the interventions of 9W Halo and ANGII into the Non-Ag Pool in accordance with Watermaster's recommendations.

III. CONCLUSION

For all of the reasons discussed above, Watermaster respectfully requests that this Court 5





Said intervention must be confirmed by order of this Court. Such intervener shall thereafter be a party bound by this judgment and entitled to the rights and privileges accorded under the Physical Solution herein, through the pool to which the Court shall assign such intervener."

According to Watermaster's Rules and Regulations section 2.27:

"Watermaster will receive and make recommendations regarding petitions for intervention and accumulate them for filing with the Court from time to time (Judgment paragraph. 60 and Order re Intervention Procedures, July 14, 1978.)"

SUMMARY

Recommendation – Staff recommends approval of the Restorative Justice Center (dba the Community Garden Project of Rancho Cucamonga) into the Agricultural Pool.

BACKGROUND

According to Paragraph 60 of the Judgment:

"[Any] person newly proposing to produce water from the Chino Basin may become a party to this Judgment upon filing a petition in intervention. Said intervention must be confirmed by order of this Court. Such intervener shall thereafter be a party bound by this judgment and entitled to the rights and privileges accorded under the Physical Solution herein, through the pool to which the Court shall assign such intervener."

According to Watermaster's Rules and Regulations section 2.27:

"Watermaster will receive and make recommendations regarding petitions for intervention and accumulate them for filing with the Court from time to time. [Judgment Paragraph 60 and Order re Intervention Procedures, July 14, 1978.]"

Watermaster received a petition to Intervene into the Judgment from the Restorative Justice Center (dba the Community Garden Project of Rancho Cucamonga) dated December 15, 2010. This non-profit organization is in the process of developing a 15-acre community garden in Rancho Cucamonga. The Community Garden property is located on Foothill Boulevard, just to the west of Day Creek Boulevard in the Edison easement, next to Sears Grand. The organization intends to have approximately 3-4 acres of vineyards, with the remainder of the land (minus walkways, the Edison access road, and clearance around the Edison tower) used for community garden plots. It will all be phased in by five-acre increments over the next 3-4 years. There is an old (inactive) vineyard well on the site that they intend rehabilitate and place into service. The estimated ultimate annual water production is approximately 24 acre-feet, and as such, the well will be metered.

Intervention of Restorative Justice Center (dba the Community Garden Project of Rancho Cucamonga)





C. INTERVENTION INTO THE AGRICULTURAL POOL

Intervention of Restorative Justice Center (dba the Community Garden Project of Rancho Cucamonga) into the Agricultural Pool

Item C was pulled for discussion:

Mr. Manning stated this item has gone to the Pools and the Advisory Committee and is coming before this Board with more than an 80% in favor vote for the Community Garden Project. Mr. Manning stated that both the Appropriative Pool and Advisory Committee meetings recommended this action be delayed in order for additional clarity to be made for the criteria necessary for inclusion, and other kinds of issues related to these inclusions of the Agricultural Pool. Mr. Kinsey stated his comments today are a follow up to the comments which were made at the recent Appropriative Pool and Advisory Committee meetings. Mr. Kinsey stated he does believe this is an agricultural use; however, the concern is there are prohibitions in the Peace II Agreement which would make it difficult for community gardens to be formed and set up throughout the balance of the Chino Basin. Mr. Kinsey offered comment regarding equitable treatment for the land use, water delivery methods, and the established assignment process. Mr. Kinsey stated the issue is being raised as to the intent of Peace II in terms of agricultural usage out of agricultural area number 1, and offered further comment on this matter of concern. Mr. Kinsey stated he voted no because before this is moved forward with this process, this issue should be addressed and show consistency. A lengthy discussion regarding Mr. Kinsey's comments ensued. Mr. Manning stated staff understands what Mr. Kinsey is discussing and that these issues going forward could have some implication on approvals or interventions. The Advisory Committee moved to approve with a caveat which was slightly different than the motion given by the Appropriative Pool; both left this intervention as recommended by staff because it is clearly an agricultural use. Mr. Manning stated separate from the criteria that Mr. Kinsey describes, the Advisory Committee took action to approve the intervention into the Agricultural Pool and included in their motion was the creation of a sub-committee that would look at criteria for future interventions dealing with these issues of community gardens. Staff accepts this is something that needs to be done and that is the motion sent to this board. A discussion regarding this matter ensued.

III. REPORTS/UPDATES

A. WATERMASTER GENERAL LEGAL COUNSEL REPORT

1. Draft Restated Watermaster Judgment

Counsel Slater stated the draft Restated Watermaster Judgment is in process and is posted on the Watermaster ftp site. Counsel Slater stated most of the comments received relate not to the textural matters but to the party clean up, and there have been efforts by the Agricultural Pool to address the special circumstances within the Pool. Counsel Slater stated it is the opinion of staff and counsel that we are not prepared to take anything to the court at the present time. There is an April hearing scheduled and staff and counsel are preparing to present it to the court at that hearing.

2. January 21, 2011 Hearing

Counsel Slater stated the January 21, 2011 hearing did take place and the Watermaster nine-member board was reapproved at that hearing. A subsequent hearing has been scheduled for April 22, 2011 at 10:30 a.m. and there will be a couple of matters before the court; the Restated Watermaster Judgment and the Resolution regarding the CDA Expansion.

3. January 26, 2011 Settlement Conference

Counsel Slater stated the January 26, 2011 settlement conference occurred yesterday regarding the Purchase and Sale Agreement and the opposition of the Overlying Non-Agricultural Pool regarding the disposition of that water. The conference was attended by Director Field, Director Camacho, and Director Kuhn. The process was well attended and lasted most of the day; however, no settlement was forth coming. Counsel Slater stated it appears that if there is not a backchannel breakthrough the court will begin setting a briefing schedule and it will proceed to a hearing on the merits. Counsel Slater stated this item will be discussed in greater detail during the closed session.

4. Santa Ana Sucker Critical Habitat Designation

Counsel Slater stated this matter is being followed closely. The parties most affected by the recent decision are getting together to develop a strategy to take into account administrative, legal, and legislative options. Counsel Slater stated Watermaster is not leading that effort and are only monitoring it, and will apply whatever effort is thought necessary. Counsel Slater stated counsel will keep the parties apprised.

B. ENGINEERING REPORT

1. MZ1 Progress Report

Mr. Malone stated there was a Land Subsidence Committee meeting last week which was the first meeting for this newly formed committee. This committee was formerly the MZ1 Technical Committee which was comprised of MZ1 parties and their technical consultants. This committee is now being opened up to all Watermaster parties and the reason is that over the years subsidence has been seen as a phenomenon that is not unique to the Management Zone 1 and it seems to be occurring in other parts of the basin as well. Subsidence is a very important issue to many parties of the Watermaster, especially as this basin urbanizes out and water levels are purposely being drawing down; this is controlled overdraft. Mr. Malone stated there are other parts of the basin where subsidence and ground fissuring could potentially be a threat. Mr. Malone stated another reason to open this committee up is because all Watermaster parties financially contribute to these monitoring and subsidence management efforts. This should be an opportunity for all to have a say or come to the meetings and learn about these issues and how their money is being spent. Mr. Malone stated these meetings have typically occurred in a series of monthly meetings about this time of the year for two reasons: 1) A look at the historical data and the recent data that has been collected, and 2) A scope of work is put together and cost estimates are attached for the next fiscal year's efforts. Eventually, this committee recommends to Watermaster that scope of work and that budget for Watermaster's budgeting efforts. Mr. Malone reviewed InSAR maps and discussed them in great detail.

Mr. Malone noted there is another meeting for the Land Subsidence Committee which will take place on January 31, 2011, at the Wildermuth Environmental office; however, this particular meeting will be a highly technical meeting. All are invited to this meeting. The next regular Land Subsidence Committee meeting is scheduled for February 17, 2011, at 10:30 a.m. directly after the Advisory Committee meeting. A discussion regarding the recent heavy rainfall which could affect the subsidence areas and costs with regard to InSAR and land sources data ensued. Mr. Vanden Heuvel offered comment on monies being spent on these types of technical instruments.

2. Modeling of the Chino Desalter Well Field

Mr. Malone stated Wildermuth has performed some modeling for the Chino Desalter Well Field and he expects to have the results in shortly and will review the modeling efforts at an upcoming meeting.

Added Comment:

Chair Willis stated Mr. Manning has been offered a position elsewhere and he has accepted it; he will be starting that new position on March 1, 2011. Chair Willis thanked Mr. Manning for his hard work and dedication over these past six plus years with Chino Basin Watermaster. Mr. Manning stated since he started as the CEO of Watermaster since 2004, he has gotten to know so many wonderful people and has thoroughly enjoyed working with each person. Mr. Manning stated this basin is an example of how basin management should be done anywhere; this interaction of stakeholders is the solution to groundwater basin management.

C. CEO/STAFF REPORT

1. <u>Legislative Update</u>

Mr. Manning stated there is a lot of discussion in Sacramento about the budget, especially regarding redevelopments and how that is going to affect water agencies or enterprise districts. Mr. Manning stated a lot more emphasis is going to be put on enterprise agencies and waste water agencies in raising fees to cover expenses. The governor is looking at \$25 billion dollars in reductions at the state level. Mr. Manning noted the May revision will come prior to the election. Mr. Manning stated there is going to be a lot of discussions taking place and everyone is watching closely. Mr. Manning offered comment on the President's State of the Union speech and noted there was no discussion on water in that speech.

2. Recharge Update

Mr. Manning commented on the calls received by various newspapers regarding the drought situation with all the recent rain. Mr. Manning commented on the recent storms and our ability to capture storm water in our basins; approximately 20 inches of rain in December in the foothills. Mr. Manning reviewed the most recent recharge spreadsheet in detail.

3. Notice of Availability - Non-Agricultural Water

Mr. Manning stated that the Notice of Availability was sent out regarding the Non-Agricultural water agencies. Mr. Manning stated Watermaster has received no affirmative notice that the Non-Agricultural Pool wants to sell any water. Mr. Manning stated Swan Lake Mobile Home Park did ask for an extension to declare whether or not they will have water available to the Appropriative Pool. Mr. Manning stated that every year before December 31st, the Non-Agricultural Pool members have to declare that they have water available to sell by January 31st and if there is water to sell, the Appropriative Pool has to declare they are going to buy it. Then, by the end of June, that water transaction has to take place.

4. New Board Members

Mr. Manning welcomed new Board members Paula Lantz and Steve Elie to the Watermaster Board and Ken Jeske who is Bob Bowcock's alternate. Mr. Manning stated that the Watermaster accomplishes great things in the Chino Basin.

5. CDA Update

Mr. Manning stated the CDA has hired a new General Manager, Curtis Paxton, and he is present today to observe our Board meeting. Mr. Manning stated at the last CDA board meeting action was taken to approve the whole suite of agreements and resolutions necessary to expand the CDA to its ultimate designation at 40,000 acre-feet per year production and the acquisition of Hydraulic Control on the west side of the basin; those two goals are critical for Watermaster. Mr. Manning thanked the key participants in accomplishing this tremendous undertaking.

6. General Electric Pool Designation

Mr. Manning stated in 1995 General Electric intervened into the Judgment. At the time GE intervened specifically into the Appropriative Pool. A series of events took place that occurred between that time and the next couple of years where they were reassigned into the Non-Agricultural Pool. Watermaster does not have records of what those circumstances were; however, there was a deliberate move to enter them into the Non-Agricultural Pool, which is where they have been since 1997. In reviewing records for the upcoming restated Judgment, this discrepancy was found. General Electric has made it known they would like to stay in the Non-Agricultural Pool and staff feels that is an appropriate designation. This is for your information only. Eventually, during an upcoming court filing staff will ask the court to clarify General Electric's position into the Non-Agricultural Pool. Mr. Manning stated all the annual reports note them as being part of the Non-Agricultural Pool and all financial records show that they are part of the Non-Agricultural Pool. A lengthy discussion regarding this matter ensued. Mr. Jeske stated GE does not have any pumping allocation in the Non-Agricultural Pool; there safe yield rights are zero. They do pump, treat, and discharge, and in the course of doing that there is a consumptive use of some of the water in the recharge process. Mr. Jeske stated for as long has he has been involved, since 1998, all the pumping has been included in the Annual Reports and the Assessment Packages in the Non-Agricultural Pool. Mr. Jeske stated the assessments paid have been recorded that way and to do anything differently could result in unwinding years of financial reports. GE came to the Non-Agricultural Pool for confirmation that that's where they were and asked that the discrepancy and the documentation be corrected in the next filing. That was a unanimous action of the Non-Agricultural Pool. Counsel Slater stated GE qualifies as a member of the Overlying Non-Agricultural Pool on the basis of the beneficial use that's being conducted on the property pursuant to the Judgment. Counsel Slater stated the definition is in paragraph 43 discussing the formation of the Pools and a production of water for industrial or commercial purposes. Counsel Slater stated the question is, do they have an allocation, and are all parties enjoined? Counsel Slater stated they did not have an allocation and would be enjoined but for the fact they produce pursuant to the physical solution, and that is to pay the replenishment costs.

BACKGROUND

Angelica Corporation (aka Southern Service Company, Blue Seal Linen) is an original Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool party pursuant to the Judgment entered in Chino Basin Municipal Water District v. City of Chino, et al., San Bernardino Superior Court No. RVCRS 51010 (formerly 164327), on January 27, 1978. It currently owns water rights consisting of 18.789 acre-feet of Safe Yield in the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool.

On April 3, 2017 Angelica Corporation (Angelica), Clothesline Holdings, Inc., and other parties as sellers, entered into an Asset Purchase Agreement (APA) with 9W Halo Holdings, L.P. (9W Halo) as purchaser of certain of the assets of Angelica and its subsidiaries. On April 28, 2017 the U.S. Bankruptcy Court, Southern District of New York entered a bankruptcy bidding procedures order in Case No. 17-10870 (JLG), thereby approving bidding procedures by the APA. 9W Halo and Angelica anticipate closure of the sale under the APA on or about June 30, 2017. Pursuant to the sale, Angelica has requested the permanent transfer of 18.789 acre-feet of its overlying groundwater productions rights to 9W Halo Western OpCo L.P. (9W Halo Western) (Attachment 1).

Angelica and 9W Halo Western have submitted Consolidated Forms 3, 4 & 5 (Application for Sale or Transfer of Right to Produce Water from Storage, Application or Amendment to Application to Recapture Water in Storage, and Application to Transfer Annual Production Right or Safe Yield – Attachment 2). The Application indicates that the quantity of Safe Yield rights to be permanently transferred from Angelica to 9W Halo Western is 18.789 acre-feet, effective in fiscal year 2017/2018.

DISCUSSION

Intervention Requests

Interventions are governed by paragraph 60 of the Judgment: "Any non-party assignee of the adjudicated appropriative rights of any appropriator, or any other person newly proposing to produce water from the Chino Basin, may become a party to this Judgment upon filing a petition in intervention. Said intervention must be confirmed by order of [the] Court. Such intervenor shall thereafter be a party bound by [the] Judgment and entitled to the rights and privileges accorded under the Physical Solution...through the pool to which the Court shall assign such intervenor."

Watermaster's practice has been to accept interventions informally by way of a letter request and then process the request through the Pools, Advisory Committee and Board. After this internal approval process, the request for Intervention is filed with the Court for approval.

Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool Membership

According to the Judgment, a producer is assigned to the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool if it is an overlying producer who produces water for industrial or commercial purposes. (Judgment, ¶ 43(b).) " Any non-party producer or any person who may hereafter commence production of water from Chino Basin, and who may become a party to [the] physical solution by intervention, shall be assigned to the proper pool by the order of the Court authorizing such intervention." (Judgment, ¶ 43.)

9W Halo Western OpCo L.P.'s Request for Intervention

9W Halo Western has requested Intervention into the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool for the purpose of accepting the Transfer of Angelica's water rights (Attachment 3). 9W Halo Western intends to be a member of the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool, and will therefore hold Carryover and Storage accounts with Watermaster within the Pool.

Pursuant to the APA, 9W Halo Western will operate Angelica Corporation's site in Pomona, California, which overlies the Chino Basin and is appurtenant to the historical production and use of overlying groundwater production rights (APN: 8337-029-002 & 8337-029-003; APN 8337-029-001; APN: 8337-029-005; APN: 8337-029-04). Upon successful intervention into the NAP, 9W Halo Western intends to use the overlying rights transferred from Angelica Corporation on the overlying property and in a manner consistent with Restated Judgment and current practices as approved through the Chino Basin Watermaster process and the San Bernardino Superior Court. 9W Halo Western has indicated that it will meter and report its overlying uses of overlying rights in a manner consistent with the Judgment and current practices as approved through the Chino Basin Watermaster process and the Court. On this basis, Watermaster staff recommends the approval of the request for Intervention.

The request for Intervention was unanimously approved by all three Pool Committees at its July 13, 2017 meeting and at the July 20, 2017 Advisory Committee meeting.

9W Halo Western OpCo L.P. ("9W Halo Western") submits this request to intervene in the above-referenced action under paragraph 60 of the Chino Basin Judgment ("Restated Judgment") as a member of the Overlying Non-Agricultural Pool ("NAP"). We request that the Chino Basin Watermaster accept permanent transfer of 18.789 acre-feet of safe yield overlying non-agricultural pool rights from Angelica Corporation. 9W Halo Western will use these rights on the property owned by Ang II (Multi) LLC and overlying the Chino Basin, consistent with the Restated Judgment as administered by the Chino Basin Watermaster.

9W Halo Western's request is based on the following facts:

- A. Angelica Corporation owns overlying groundwater production rights adjudicated to Angelica Corporation or its predecessor-in-interest under the Restated Judgment.
- B. Angelica Corporation entered into a stalking horse Asset Purchase Agreement ("APA") dated April 3, 2017 between Clothesline Holdings, Inc., Angelica Corporation and other parties as sellers and 9W Halo Holdings L.P. as purchaser of certain of the assets of Angelica Corporation and its subsidiaries. On April 28, 2017 the U.S. Bankruptcy Court, Southern District of New York entered a bankruptcy bidding procedures order in Case No. 17-10870 (JLG), thereby approving bidding procedures and the APA. 9W Halo Holdings L.P and Angelica Corporation anticipate closure of the sale under the APA on or about June 30, 2017. Pursuant to the sale, Angelica Corporation has requested the permanent transfer of 18.789 acrefect of its overlying groundwater production rights to 9W Halo Western (see attached letter and executed water transfer forms).
- C. The Restated Judgment allocates overlying water rights based on land ownership and overlying use. Pursuant to the APA, 9W Halo Western will operate Angelica Corporation's site in Pomona, California, which overlies the Chino Basin and is appurtenant to the historical production and use of overlying groundwater production rights (APN: 8337-029-002 & 8337-029-003; APN 8337-029-001; APN: 8337-029-005; APN: 8337-029-04). Upon successful intervention into the NAP, 9W Halo Western intends to use the overlying rights transferred from Angelica Corporation on

the overlying property and in a manner consistent with Restated Judgment and current practices as approved through the Chino Basin Watermaster process and the San Bernardino Superior Court. 9W Halo Western will meter and report its overlying uses of overlying rights.

BACKGROUND

Southern Service Co., dba Blue Seal Linen ("Southern Service") is identified in Exhibit "D" to the 1978 Judgment as a party holding Overlying Non-Agricultural Rights, with a share of Safe Yield of 18.789 acrefeet per year. Watermaster was informed that Angelica Corporation purchased Southern Service in the early 1980s, and since at least 2003, Watermaster has received payments for the assessments on this right from various Angelica entities (e.g., Angelica Corporation, Angelica Textile Services, Angelica Rentals).

In April 2017, Watermaster was served with court filings in the case entitled *In re: Angelica Corporation, et al.*, a Chapter 11 bankruptcy proceeding pending in the United States Bankruptcy Court, Southern District of New York (Case No. 17-10870). The debtors in the bankruptcy proceeding were identified as Clothesline Holdings, Inc., Angelica Corporation, Angelica Textile Services, Inc.-NY, Royal Institutional Services, Inc. and Angelica Textile Services, Inc.-CA. The filings initially received identified Watermaster as a utility provider to the debtor entities and stated Angelica Corporation's intention to sell all of its assets to 9W Halo Holdings LP.

At that time, Angelica believed that it was the owner of the Southern Service water rights. Following discussions with Watermaster, the debtors worked to incorporate language into the bankruptcy order approving the sale of Angelica's assets to 9W Halo Holdings LP to ensure Watermaster retained jurisdiction over the water rights and any transfer thereto. The bankruptcy court approved the sale of Angelica's assets to 9W Halo Holdings LP in June 2017 and the sale of the assets closed on June 30, 2017.

In July 2017, 9W Halo Western OpCo L.P. ("9W Halo") submitted applications to Watermaster to approve the transfer of Angelica's water rights to 9W Halo. 9W Halo also submitted a request to intervene in the Judgment. The filing of an intervention request was approved by the Watermaster Board in July 2017. The transfer was considered by the Pool Committees in July 2017, and by the Advisory Committee and Watermaster in September 2017.

While the Board approved the transfer at that time, the transfer was suspended after it was brought to Watermaster's attention that Angelica may not have been record owner of the Southern Service rights. Watermaster's legal counsel thereafter corresponded with counsel for 9W Halo regarding this concern and, over the course of 2018 and 2019, both 9W Halo and Watermaster conducted further investigation into the matter. The filing of 9W Halo's intervention request with the Court was deferred pending the outcome of the investigation.

Based upon 9W Halo's own investigation and documents submitted by 9W Halo and ANG II (Multi) LLC ("ANG II"), Watermaster is informed of the following:

- On March 25, 2010, Southern Service transferred the property located at 300 E. Commercial Street, Pomona, California 91767 and its interest in the Southern Service water rights under the Judgment to ANG II.
- Also on March 25, 2010, ANG II leased the property, including the right to use ANG II's water right under the Judgment, to Angelica Textile Services, Inc. As amended, the lease agreement runs through January 31, 2030. 9W Halo is the successor to Angelica Textile Services, Inc. under this lease.
- Watermaster was not notified of either of these transfers.
- On December 30, 2014, Southern Service filed a Domestic Stock Corporation Certificate of Dissolution with the California Secretary of State.

On January 2, 2020, ANG II submitted a letter requesting intervention in the Judgment and applications for two transfers pertaining to the right granted Southern Service in the Judgment — a permanent transfer of the Southern Service right to ANG II and a temporary transfer of the right (through January 31, 2030) from ANG II to 9W Halo.

DISCUSSION

Intervention Requests

Interventions are governed by paragraph 60 of the Judgment: "Any non-party assignee of the adjudicated appropriative rights of any appropriator, or any other person newly proposing to produce water from the Chino Basin, may become a party to this Judgment upon filing a petition in intervention. Said intervention must be confirmed by order of [the] Court. Such intervenor shall thereafter be a party bound by [the] Judgment and entitled to the rights and privileges accorded under the Physical Solution... through the pool to which the Court shall assign such intervenor."

Watermaster's practice has been to accept interventions informally by way of a letter request and then process the request through the Pools, Advisory Committee and Board. After this internal approval process, the request for Intervention is filed with the Court for approval.

Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool Membership

According to the Judgment, a producer is assigned to the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool if it is an overlying producer who produces water for industrial or commercial purposes. (Judgment, ¶ 43(b).) " Any non-party producer or any person who may hereafter commence production of water from Chino Basin, and who may become a party to [the] physical solution by intervention, shall be assigned to the proper pool by the order of the Court authorizing such intervention." (Judgment, ¶ 43.)

ANG II's Request for Intervention

ANG II has requested intervention into the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool for the purpose of accepting the Transfer of the Southern Service water rights (Attachment X). ANG II intends to be a member of the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool, and will therefore hold Carryover and Storage accounts with Watermaster within the Pool.

Pursuant to their lease, 9W Halo will operate the historical Angelica Corporation site in Pomona, California, which overlies the Chino Basin and is appurtenant to the historical production and use of overlying groundwater production rights (APN: 8337-029-002 & 8337-029-003; APN 8337-029-001; APN: 8337-029-04). Upon successful intervention, 9W Halo intends to use the overlying rights in a manner consistent with Restated Judgment and current practices as approved through the Chino Basin Watermaster process and the San Bernardino Superior Court. 9W Halo has indicated that it will meter and report its overlying uses of overlying rights in a manner consistent with the Judgment and current practices as approved through the Chino Basin Watermaster process and the Court.

Watermaster staff recommends the Board move the Court to allow the interventions of both ANG II and 9W Halo.

During their February 13, 2020 meetings, the Pool Committees unanimously recommended to the Advisory Committee to recommend Watermaster filing the Request for Intervention with the Court. At their February 20, 2020 meeting, the Advisory Committee unanimously recommended Watermaster file the request for intervention with the Court.

Our client ANG II (Multi) LLC hereby requests intervention into the Chino Basin Judgment, as administered by the Chino Basin Watermaster. We request that the Watermaster attorneys process the intervention paperwork through the Court.

ANG II (Multi) LLC is the successor-in-interest to the adjudicated, Overlying (Non-Agricultural) groundwater right previously held by Southern Service Co. dba Blue Seal Linen according to the Restated Judgment, Exhibit D, in the amount of 24 acre-feet ("Right"). ANG II (Multi) LLC acquired the property located at 300 E. Commercial Street, Pomona, California 91767 ("Property") on March 25, 2010, along with all appurtenances and the Right that is part and parcel of the property. As stated in the Restated Judgment, § 8, "[a]ll overlying rights are appurtenant to the land and cannot be assigned or conveyed separate or apart therefrom", and when the Property was transferred from Southern Service Co. to ANG II (Multi) LLC pursuant to the Grant Deed recorded as Document No. 20100470426 and attached to this letter, the Right was transferred at the same time by the same instrument. The parties to the transaction were not aware of the need to inform Watermaster at that time, but now seek to correct the record regarding proper ownership of the Right.

As you may be aware, Southern Service Company was dissolved on December 30, 2014, as demonstrated in the attached Certificate of Dissolution from the California Secretary of State. Accordingly, there is no representative of that entity who may legally execute any Watermaster forms or otherwise provide notice of the transfer of the Right to ANG II (Multi) LLC. The Grant Deed itself is sufficient evidence of the transfer of the Right.

Attached to this letter is Watermaster Forms 3-5 regarding the transfer, executed by ANG II (Multi) LLC. This transfer constitutes a permanent assignment of the Right from Southern Service Co. to ANG II (Multi) LLC. Exercise of the Right will be identical to the manner in which it was exercised pre-transfer.

Please be aware that as of March 25, 2010, when ANG II (Multi) LLC became the owner of the Property and the Right, ANG II (Multi) LLC also entered into a lease agreement for the Property with Angelica Textile Services, Inc. That leasehold interest is currently governed by an Amended and Restated Lease Agreement dated April 24, 2011, and the current tenant is 9W Halo Western OpCo L.P. ("9W Halo"). Attached to this letter is Watermaster Forms 3-5 regarding the lease of the Right to 9W Halo, executed by ANG II (Multi) LLC and 9W Halo. This transfer constitutes a temporary lease of the Right from ANG II (Multi) LLC to 9W Halo ending at 11:59 p.m. EST on January 31, 2030.

It is our understanding that 9W Halo previously requested intervention into the Chino Basin Judgment. We support its intervention request, and we further authorize 9W Halo to act before Watermaster regarding the Right, for purposes of receiving notices, signing water activity reports, paying assessments, appointing a representative to the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool Committee and similar actions. 9W Halo may assign its interest in the Right to a third party and file appropriate transfer forms with Watermaster, but any such transfer would be subject to the interests of ANG II (Multi) LLC. We do request that ANG II (Multi) LLC continue to receive notices regarding the Right and the adjudication, c/o Tannaz Simyar, First Vice President and Associate Transactions Counsel, W. P. Carey Inc., 50 Rockefeller Plaza, New York, NY 10020.
