DECLARATION OF BRADLEY J. HERREMA

I, Bradley J. Herrema, declare:

1. I am an attorney duly admitted to practice before all of the courts of this State, and am a shareholder in the law firm of Brownstein Hyatt Farber Schreck, LLP, counsel of record for Chino Basin Watermaster ("Watermaster"). I have personal knowledge of the facts stated in this declaration, except where stated on information and belief, and, if called as a witness, I could and would competently testify to them under oath. I make this declaration in support of the above-referenced request.

2. As legal counsel for Watermaster, I am familiar with Watermaster's practices and procedures, as well as actions taken by the Pool Committees, Advisory Committee, and Board.

3. Over the course of the past several years, Watermaster staff and counsel have undertaken efforts to ensure this Court has approved the intervention of all active parties under the Judgment.

4. Attached hereto as **Exhibit A** is a true and correct copy of the January 10, 2002 Watermaster Staff Report detailing the petition to intervene in the Appropriative Pool submitted by Nicholson Trust.

5. Attached hereto as **Exhibit B** is a true and correct copy of the Minutes from the Watermaster Board meeting on February 28, 2002, during which the Board unanimously voted to recommend to the Court the approval of Nicholson Trust's intervention request.

6. In April 2020, the Nicholson Trust notified Watermaster that, due to the death of one of the trustees, the water rights had been transferred to a successor trust, the Nicholson Family Trust – Exempt Marital Trust.

7. Attached hereto as **Exhibit C** is a true and correct copy of the July 23, 2020 Staff Report detailing the petition to intervene in the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool submitted by Hamner Park Associates, LP.

8. The Watermaster Board unanimously recommended approval of Hamner Park's intervention into the Non-Ag Pool at its July 23, 2020 regular meeting.

SUMMARY

Issue – The Nicholson Trust has petitioned to intervene into the Chino Basin Judgment as a party in the Appropriative Pool.

Recommendation – Recommend the Nicholson Trust Petition in Intervention be approved pursuant to the Judgment for subsequent filing with the Court.

Fiscal Impact – None.

BACKGROUND

By action on December 13, 2001, the Nicholson Trust acquired all right, title and interests to four (4) acre-feet of the operating safe yield (water rights) adjudicated to the Fontana Union Water Company under the Judgment.

Prior to this date, Cucamonga County Water District had leased the annual production right to the water but had not acquired any of the permanent operating safe yield rights of Fontana Union Water Company. The permanent transfer of the operating safe yield to the Nicholson Trust is a distribution of four (4) acre-feet of Fontana Union Water Company original rights. Notice of the water transaction was mailed on January 4, 2002.

DISCUSSION

The Nicholson Trust has completed the following Petition in Intervention. Upon approval, the Nicholson Trust will be bound by the Judgment and entitled to the rights and privileges accorded under the Physical Solution in the Judgment through the Appropriative Pool.

3. PETITION IN INTERVENTION

The Nicholson Trust has petitioned to intervene into the Chino Basin Judgment for assignment into the Appropriative Pool. A unanimous recommendation came forward from the pool meetings and the Advisory Committee.

Motion by Member Hofer, second by Member Arbelbide and by unanimous vote.

Moved, to approve the Nicholson Trust's Petition in Intervention (noticed January 4, 2002 with the meeting package).

4. WATER TRANSACTIONS

As indicated in the Staff Report, the following water transactions came forward with a unanimous recommendation from the pool meetings held in January. Additionally, the Advisory Committee is forwarding a unanimous recommendation from its meeting held earlier today.

Motion by Member Hofer, second by Member Arbelbide and by unanimous vote.

Moved, to approve the Notice of Sale or Transfer of Right to Produce Water from Storage from the San Antonio Water Company to Jurupa Community Services District in the amount of 650.000 acre-feet (noticed January 4, 2002 with meeting package).

Motion by Member Yates, second by Member Arbelbide and by unanimous vote.

Moved, to approve the Notice of Permanent Transfer of 5.000 acre-feet of Operating Safe Yield from Fontana Union Water Company: 1.000 acre-feet to Fontana Water Company and 4.000 acre-feet to the Nicholson Trust. (Noticed January 4, 2002 with meeting package)

Motion by Member Arbelbide, second by Member DeJesus and by unanimous vote.

Moved, to approve the Notice of MVWD Application to Recharge up to 10,000.000 acre-feet of supplemental water and request for waiver of 21-day notification provision of Article 10 process. (Noticed February 14, 2002 with meeting package)

5. DRAFT INITIAL STATE OF THE BASIN REPORT

Mr. Wildermuth reported that the Initial State of the Basin Report (ISOB) was originally submitted to the Court in January. Editorial comments were received from the City of Chino, San Antonio Water Company and the Agricultural Pool. The Draft ISOB was recommended for approval and forwarded from the pool meetings held earlier this month and the Advisory Committee meeting held earlier today. Responses to the comments and suggestions from the Special Referee's Report and Recommendation will be developed and will be submitted through the Watermaster process at the April meetings.

6. BASIN PLAN UPDATE - MAXIMUM BENEFIT DEMONSTRATION

Mr. Wildermuth reported that he is prepared to make a demonstration to the RWQCB on objectives based on ambient water quality or maximum benefit to establish TIN/TDS objectives for the Basin Plan Update. A recommendation to approve the demonstration to the RWQCB is coming forward from the pool committees and the Advisory Committee.

Motion by Member DuBois, second by Member Yates and by unanimous vote.

Moved, to approve the Maximum Benefit Demonstration be presented to the RWQCB for consideration.

7. LETTER OF SUPPORT

The Watermaster has been asked to support the nomination of Robert Neufeld to the Drinking Water Subcommittee. Its mission is to provide policy advice and leadership to the newly formed Bay-Delta Public Advisory Committee on implementation of CalFED's Drinking Water Quality Program. Member Yates offered a statement of support and commended Mr. Neufeld for his involvement and commitment on issues.

Motion by Member DeJesus, second by Member Hofer and by unanimous vote.

Moved, to approve the letter supporting Cucamonga County Water District's recommendation to appoint Robert Neufeld to the Drinking Water Subcommittee.

REPORTS/UPDATES**8. OBMP ACTIVITIES****A. Chino Desalter Authority**

Mr. Rossi reported that the Desalter Bond funded on February 27. Mr. Jeske and Member Yates commended the stakeholders for their exemplary efforts. Attorneys Erickson, Schatz and Brown were also recognized for their tireless efforts in bringing about the success of the CDA.

B. Recharge Implementation Status Report

Mr. Dave Argo provided a report on activities to date on the implementation of the Recharge Master Plan. The report centered on design efforts, geotechnical investigations and recharge capacities for the basins. It is planned that all improvements will be under construction by June 30, 2003 to meet the schedule to use Prop 13 funding. Several basins will be ready to proceed this year and the remaining facilities set for next year. Some issues regarding habitat and multiple uses have arisen regarding the Turner and San Sevaine Basins and discussions will be occurring beginning the first week of March to develop alternatives.

9. WATERMASTER GENERAL LEGAL COUNSEL REPORT**A. Professor Sax Report**

Watermaster Legal Counsel Slater reported that Professor Sax's report is now available on the SWRCB website. Watermaster Legal Counsel is preparing a position paper that addresses the report. The paper will be submitted through the Watermaster process in March.

B. Subsidence Report

Watermaster Legal Counsel Slater provided an update on the progress that has been made regarding the subsidence issue. An MZ1 Interim Management Technical Committee has been formed and the first meeting will take place at the Watermaster offices on March 6 at 12:00 noon. The Court will be notified of this at the hearing being held today at 11:00 a.m. It was also reported that the City of Chino is withdrawing their motion that was set for hearing later today and that preliminary meetings among the City and the Monte Vista Water District have taken place in this regard.

C. Desalter Hearing

Watermaster Legal Counsel Slater reported on the successful bond closing relative to the desalter. The Court issued an order after the February 20 hearing indicating that we are in full compliance.

D. SWRCB - Santa Ana River Water Rights Petition

Watermaster Legal Counsel Slater reported that discussions have been taking place regarding Watermaster's application to appropriate water. It is expected that the SWRCB will grant the requested extension by the end of business today however; counsel recommended that he be given direction to file a protest if that does not happen.

Motion by Member Hofer, second by Member Yates and by unanimous vote.

Moved, to direct Watermaster Legal Counsel to file a protest on the Orange County application if it becomes necessary.

10. CEO/STAFF REPORT**A. AB 599 Public Advisory Committee**

Mr. Rossi reported that he is pleased to be representing the Watermaster on this committee. A kick off meeting was held in Sacramento on February 27 and he will provide a full report through the Watermaster process at the March meetings.

B. Extensometers

Mr. Rossi reported that a meeting would be held at 2:00 p.m. today with CIM officials to discuss alternate locations for the extensometers. Continued meetings are also being set up with the City of Chino in this regard.

11. AGENCY REPRESENTATIVE REPORTS**A. AGWA**

Mr. Rossi reported that AGWA met at the Watermaster office on February 25. Bruce Mowry has been elected Chairman and the membership is currently reviewing their mission statement and focusing on salinity issues as well as monitoring legislation. The next meeting will be at the Main San Gabriel offices on March 18.

B. Other Agency Reports

Mr. Rice reported that Watermaster staff along with five other agencies has begun taking water samples for the RWQCB Pathogen TMDL's program. He said the Regional Board is very appreciative of Watermaster's cooperation in this effort.

12. COMMITTEE MEMBER COMMENTS


Member Yates reported that discussions have been taking place with MVWD Board President Quincey and Member Josephine Johnson and it has resulted in an agreement to resolve the issues that were identified in their separate Court filings. He reported that the City's attorney would be withdrawing their motion at the Court hearing later today and he understood that MVWD would also be withdrawing their motion.

Member DeJesus commended the City of Chino and MVWD for their efforts to work through the issues.

SUMMARY:

Issue: On June 22, 2020, Hamner Park Associates, LP submitted a letter requesting intervention in the Judgment and an application for a transfer of the Carlsberg Mobile Home Properties, LTD '73 water rights from Carlsberg Mobile Home Properties, LTD to Hamner Park Associates, LP effective September 1987.

Recommendation: Direct staff to file the request for intervention with the Court.

Financial Impact: None

Future Consideration

Watermaster Board – July 23, 2020: Recommend to Court [Within WM Duties and Powers]

ACTIONS:

Appropriative Pool – July 09, 2020: Unanimously recommended to the Advisory Committee to recommend to the Watermaster Board to recommend to the Court to approve the request for intervention.

Non-Agricultural Pool – July 09, 2020: Unanimously recommended Pool representatives to support at the Advisory Committee and Board meetings subject to changes which they deem appropriate; and submitted a resolution should the Hamner Park documents not move forward.

Agricultural Pool – July 09, 2020: Unanimously recommended to the Advisory Committee to recommend to the Watermaster Board to recommend to the Court to approve the request for intervention.

Advisory Committee – July 16, 2020: Unanimously recommended to the Watermaster Board to recommend to the Court to approve the request for intervention

Watermaster Board – July 23, 2020:

Watermaster's function is to administer and enforce provisions of the Judgment and subsequent orders of the Court, and to develop and implement an Optimum Basin Management Program

BACKGROUND

Carlsberg Mobile Home Properties, LTD '73 ("Carlsberg") is identified in Exhibit "D" to the 1978 Judgment as a party holding Overlying Non-Agricultural Rights, with a share of Safe Yield of 464.240 acre-feet per year. Watermaster is informed that, in 1987, Carlsberg transferred its real property described in the attached Partnership Grant Deed to Hamner Park Associates, LP ("Hamner Park"). This transfer included Carlsberg's water rights under the Judgment as, at that time, all overlying rights were considered appurtenant to the land and could not be assigned or conveyed separate or apart therefrom. (Judgment, ¶ 8.)

Watermaster has not been able to locate any approval of the transfer of Carlsberg's water rights, or Hamner Park's intervention as a Party to the Judgment. However, Hamner Park has participated as a Party to the Judgment since 1987, complying with the provisions of the Judgment and appearing in hearings before the Court in the case entitled *Chino Basin Municipal Water District v. City of Chino* (San Bernardino Superior Court Case No. RCVRS 51010).

To clarify its status as a Party to the Judgment holding the former Carlsberg water rights, on June 22, 2020, Hamner Park submitted a letter requesting intervention in the Judgment and an application for a transfer of the Carlsberg water rights from Carlsberg to Hamner Park effective September 1987.

DISCUSSION

Intervention Requests

Interventions are governed by paragraph 60 of the Restated Judgment: "Any non-party assignee of the adjudicated appropriative rights of any appropriator, or any other person newly proposing to produce water from the Chino Basin, may become a party to this Judgment upon filing a petition in intervention. Said intervention must be confirmed by order of [the] Court. Such intervenor shall thereafter be a party bound by [the] Judgment and entitled to the rights and privileges accorded under the Physical Solution... through the pool to which the Court shall assign such intervenor."

Watermaster's practice has been to accept interventions informally by way of a letter request and then process the request through the Pools, Advisory Committee, and Board. After this internal recommendation process, the request for intervention is filed with the Court for approval.

Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool Membership

According to the Restated Judgment, a producer is assigned to the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool if it is an overlying producer who produces water for industrial or commercial purposes. (Restated Judgment, ¶ 43(b).) "Any non-party producer or any person who may hereafter commence production of water from Chino Basin, and who may become a party to [the] physical solution by intervention, shall be assigned to the proper pool by the order of the Court authorizing such intervention." (Restated Judgment, ¶ 43.)

Hamner Park's Request for Intervention

Hamner Park has requested confirmation of intervention into the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool for the purpose of confirming the Transfer of the Carlsberg water rights (Attachment 1). Hamner Park intends to continue as a member of the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool, and will therefore hold Storage accounts with Watermaster within the Pool.

Hamner Park intends to continue its use of the overlying rights in a manner consistent with the Restated Judgment and current practices as approved through the Chino Basin Watermaster process and the San Bernardino Superior Court. Hamner Park has indicated that it will continue to meter and report its overlying uses of overlying rights in a manner consistent with the Judgment and current practices as approved through the Chino Basin Watermaster process and the Court.

Watermaster staff recommends the Board move the Court to confirm the intervention of Hamner Park.

Watermaster's function is to administer and enforce provisions of the Judgment and subsequent orders of the Court, and to develop and implement an Optimum Basin Management Program


I write on behalf of Hamner Park Associates, LP (“Hamner Park”) to request that Chino Basin Watermaster (“Watermaster”) move the Court in Chino Basin Municipal Water District v. City of Chino (San Bernardino Superior Court Case No. RCVRS51010) (“Action”) to confirm Hamner Park’s status as a party to the Action.

Hamner Park is the successor-in-interest to the adjudicated, Overlying (Non-Agricultural) groundwater right granted to Carlsberg Mobile Home Properties, LTD. – ’73 (“Carlsberg”) in the 1978 Judgment. Hamner Park succeeded to the right in 1987, when Carlsberg transferred its real property, including all appurtenances and the groundwater right part and parcel to the property, to Hamner Park, as detailed more fully in the attached Partnership Grant Deed. At that time, there were no exceptions to the rule that the subject water rights were appurtenant to and transferred along with the land. Since that time, Hamner Park has been an active party in the Action. It has complied with all aspects of the Restated Judgment, and filed and appeared in hearings before the Court.

Despite this history of active involvement, Watermaster has indicated that it has been unable to locate a resolution from this Board recommending Hamner Park’s intervention into the Action or an order from the Court approving Hamner Park’s intervention. Accordingly, Hamner Park now requests that Watermaster request the Court confirm Hamner Park’s intervention in the Action as a member of the Overlying (Non-Agricultural) Pool and as successor to the right granted to Carlsberg in the Judgment, effective September 1987.

Furthermore, Watermaster has been unable to locate documents reflecting the transfer of the groundwater right granted to Carlsberg to Hamner Park. Accordingly, to accurately document this transaction, Hamner Park is attaching Watermaster Forms 3-5 regarding the permanent transfer of the groundwater right to Hamner Park. This transfer is evidenced by the Grant Deed¹ and should be effective as of the date of the Grant Deed. Exercise of the groundwater right will be identical to the manner in which Hamner Park has exercised the right for the past 30 years.
