

Cucamonga Valley Water District Educates Community

About State Water Issues

Rancho Cucamonga, CA – On January 30, 2008, over 40 Cucamonga Valley Water District (CVWD/ District) customers were in attendance at a workshop designed to educate them about the status of the Sacramento-San Joaquin Bay Delta and how it impacts our local water supplies. The educational workshop entitled "**California's Water Crisis: A Local Issue**" featured Mr. Randall Neudeck, Program Manager for the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California, who shared with attendees the issues currently plaguing the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta. Robert DeLoach, General Manager/CEO for CVWD, as well as Marty Zvirbulis, Deputy General Manager for CVWD, outlined the local water supply challenges for the agency and provided insight on what the District is specifically doing to ensure a high quality, reliable water supply for all customers.

"It's encouraging to know that our customers are interested in learning about the issues that impact their water supply and how we can work together in order to ensure a reliable supply for everyone," stated James V.
